REAR ADMIRAL BRIAN PENOYER

U.S. Coast Guard, Commander, Eleventh Coast Guard District



Rear Admiral Brian K. Penoyer assumed his duties as Commander, Eleventh Coast Guard District in July of 2020. As such, he oversees the Coast Guard's safety, security, law enforcement and environmental stewardship operations from the California-Oregon border to Peru including Arizona, Utah, and Nevada. He previously served as Commander, Coast Guard Force Readiness since July 2018. The Force Readiness Command directs the activity of 41 subordinate units in 17

states impacting every Coast Guard Mission... every unit... every enlisted rating... and every officer specially... every day... to deliver mission-ready forces through superior training, doctrine, leader development, readiness assessments, and major exercise support. He has been awarded two Legion of Merits, five Meritorious Service Medals, three Coast Guard Commendation Medals, the Department of Transportation "9-11" Medal, and several campaign medals including the Southwest Asia Service Medal.

ALAN WONG

Trustee, San Francisco City College Board



Alan Wong was born and raised in San Francisco, where he attended Hoover Middle School and Lincoln High School. As a teenager, Alan took City College classes for free with a low-income tuition waiver. The City College units Alan earned helped him to graduate from U.C. San Diego with a bachelor's degree at age 19.

Upon graduating from college, Alan dedicated his life to public service. As a union organizer, he worked on initiatives to raise the California

minimum wage and protect jobs from outsourcing. As an eleven-year veteran and lieutenant in the National Guard, he has been deployed multiple times to provide disaster relief and security during California wildfires. In Alan's current work as Education Policy Advisor for SF Supervisor Gordon Mar, Alan helped draft and advance the 'Free City College' legislation at the SF Board of Supervisors to secure a decade of Free City College. Alan also brought the City College Sunset campus to his neighborhood.

Supervisor Catherine Stefani, District 2, is a City Hall veteran, gun violence prevention activist, and former prosecutor. Her district includes the Presidio, Marina, Cow Hollow, Pacific Heights, Presidio Heights, Anza Vista, Laurel Heights, Jordan Park, the Lake Street corridor, Sea Cliff and parts of Russian Hill.

Stefani is vice chair of the Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee. She serves on the Golden Gate Bridge District

Board, the Family Violence Council, and the Department of Emergency Management Disaster Council. She is an alternate member of the Bay Conservation and Development Commission.

Stefani graduated from St. Mary's College and earned a J.D. and an LL.M. from McGeorge School of Law. She is married, has two children, and has lived in Cow Hollow for over 20 years.

After 25 years as the lead vocalist for Santana, Tony Lindsay has garnered 11 Grammy awards, traveled on numerous world tours and recorded on seven Santana CDs: *Milagro* (1992), *Supernatural* (1999), *Shaman* (2002), *Ceremony* (2003), *Food for Thought* (2004), *Ultimate Santana* (2007), *Multi-Dimensional Warrior* (2008). In addition to many Grammy Show performances, Tony's time with Santana included a 2003 pre-game performance at Super Bowl XXXVII

where they were joined onstage by Beyonce.

In 2015, Carlos Santana decided to change personnel in his band and set the wheels in motion for Tony to start on his 5th solo CD *Something Beautiful*. His previous solo albums are *Different Moods* (1995), *The Message is Love* (1997), *Tony Lindsay*, and *Memoirs* (2014). he San Francisco National Cemetery was established in 1884. Originally comprised of 9.5 acres of land, including a previously established post cemetery, the Cemetery subsequently increased in size to the present 28.3 acres. The setting aside a portion of the Presidio as a national cemetery marked the establishment of the first such cemetery on the Pacific Coast and further evidenced the growth and development of a system of national cemeteries extending beyond the area of conflict of the Civil War.

Initial interments in the San
Francisco National Cemetery
included remains of descendents
interred in the original post cemetery,
as well as those removed from
cemeteries at several abandoned
forts and camps along the Pacific
Coast and other parts of the West,
including Arizona, Nevada, Oregon
and Washington.

The following monuments can be found at Sf National Cemetery:

★ The Grand Army of the Republic G.A.R. Memorial, a tall granite obelisk in memory of the Civil War dead, was erected in the George H. Thomas Section (GHT), by G.A.R. Post No. 2 and was dedicated on 30 May, 1893.

- ★ The Pacific Garrison Memorial, in the East Side Section (ES), am ornate granite pedestal surmounted by the figure of a soldier with battle flag, was dedicated to the Regular Army and Navy Union by the Pacific Coast Garrison on Memorial Day 1897.
- ★ The Unknown Dead Monument is located in the former main driveway of the cemetery as it passes between the Post Plot New Addition (PPNA) and Post Plot West Section (PPWS). An American Eagle carved on the stone in bold relief bears upon its breast a shield inscribed with the words TO THE UNKNOWN DEAD.
- ★ The American War Mothers
 Monument, erected by the San
 Francisco Chapter, is located in a
 small plot in the main drive passing
 through Section B.


